Week Three

Reading Expectation: Re-read Chapters 5 and 6

Learning Objective: ("Each participant...")

- · Can use higher-order thinking to develop helpful practices.
- Will discuss the central theme of The Orange Frog and discover it's metaphorical connections to everyday life.

Essential Concept:

Skills Required:

Opening question(s):

"What do you guys remember about the story?"

Thoughts for Consideration:

We learn early on in the chapters that Spark becomes orange, knows he wants to remain orange, and decides to figure out how to do just that.

Spark realizes that the most orange he has ever been, was when he was helping others. Spark starts to do experiments to decide what creates his stunning orange complexion.

Connecting This Lesson To Our Work:

Action:

Bull takes the time to decide. He wants to do whatever it takes. The next morning while fishing, he gained an orange spot.

Misty gained a spot when she thought about how beautiful the pond was. What do you think it would take for you to get an orange spot?
